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

# Buzz from Ms. S

Wow! September is already gone and October is quickly fading away as well. I hope everyone had a wonderful Thanksgiving break. I was blessed to be able to go home and spend some time with my family.

In September the students in the grade 7/8 class completed their first round of letters to their pen-pals in Lesotho, Africa! They also completed their quilting squares for the blanket that I'll be taking there for Christmas.

The other day I received a email from one of the workers for the orphanage in Pulane, Lesotho. It was for their Christmas initiative. The children didn't receive much for Christmas last year, if anything at all. The grade 7/8 class is going to be holding fundraisers from now till November 20<sup>th</sup>. Our goal is to raise \$ 300. The students would like to raise this amount so that each of their pen-pals received a gift at Christmas. Through the organizer I am able to wire the money to the people in charge of Christmas handouts in the area and with that money they will create shoeboxes for our students that will go directly to their pen-pals. We are really excited about this as a class. So we hope that the community will support us in our fundraising efforts!

In Language Arts, we are also finishing our unit on *Invictus*. The students have gained a lot of knowledge on the Apartheid in South Africa.

They had the opportunity to talk to someone in South Africa via Skype about life during the Apartheid and as well what life was like in general in South Africa. We are finishing up our last projects for the unit. The final task will be a in class essay for the students.

In Social Studies, the students finish their first unit on the Aboriginals people in Canada. I was slightly disappointed with some of the student's results. It is important for the students to study for all exams. Social Studies this year, will not be easy and there is a lot to know. I do my best to make it as simple as possible for them to remember the context but they have to do their part as well. We have moved on to the conjoining section with the European explorers and the fur trade.

Grade nine Social Studies units are progressing smoothly. After we have completed our unit on the Youth Criminal Justice System the students will complete their first unit test. Their tests are designed to simulate their Provincial Achievement Exams at the end of the year. This exam is worth 30% of their overall mark. It is important for the students to take their in-class exams seriously, so there are no surprise come the end of year.

For the 3/4 Social class we are slowly but steadily coming along in our unit. We are taking a look at the different regions for Alberta. We are currently working on our first region. The

Rocky Mountain Region. I am hoping to be done by the end of the week. If not shortly after.
